

NOTES:[1] Entry Fees for MINI-BRIDGE are per player per session. Each session of Mini-Bridge begins with a short teach-in for absolute beginners which is followed by a tournament.

[2] Entry Fees for all events are per player and not per pair or team.

- [3] "The Times" CROSSWORD PUZZLE CHAMPIONSHIP is by qualification only. The qualifying puzzle will be published in "The Times". Two heats will be held on August 21<sup>st</sup> with the finals on August 22<sup>sd</sup>.
- [4] To compete for the PENTAMIND medals players must enter tournaments for 5 or more different games or mental skills. The first two letters of the game code indicates the game or mental skill. AT LEAST TWO OF THESE EVENTS MUST BE PLAYED OVER THREE OR MORE SESSIONS. Pentamind points are scored according to where the player finishes in each tournament. The players with the highest total Pentamind scores from their 5 best tournaments for different games and mental skills, including two tournaments with three or more sessions, will win the medals and the prizes. Players may enter as many tournaments as they wish for a maximum entry fee of £75 (juniors £30), excluding the MSO Masters Chess Championship. Players may include only one beginners' tournament or Mini-Bridge in the 5 best results. SPECIAL NOTE: Any Pentamind participant who enters and starts play in a tournament and then withdraws from it before playing at least half of the games will have that tournament included in his score calculations as one of his five events. No player may enter for tournaments which clash in the playing schedule.

Players who enter five events or more may register for the Pentamind by getting a Pentamind card to keep the results of their games. These must be handed in to the Games Control Room before close of play on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> August. Any improvement in Pentamind Scores on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> August must be notified to the Games Control Room by 19.30. Only results handed in on the Pentamind Scorecard will be counted towards the medal tally.

The scoring system for Pentamind is as follows: Each tournament has the same value. Your Pentamind score in a tournament is

[ (p-n) x 100 ] / [ p-1 ]

where p is the number of players in the tournament and n is the position in which you finished in that tournament (tied positions are counted as the average of the positions in the tie, e.g. a tie for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places counts as 1.5).

- [5] The "DECAMENTATHLON" will test the following games and skills: Bridge, Chess, Creative Thinking, Draughts (Checkers) 8 x 8, Go, Intelligence, Mastermind, Memory Skills, Mental Calculations and Othello. The Decamentathlon is a single tournament taking place on August 23<sup>rd</sup> you do not need to play in 10 different tournaments to qualify.
- [6] THE WORLD AMATEUR POKER CHAMPION will be the player with the best aggregate from any four Poker tournaments played August 21\*-27th. The entry fee is £15 per tournament with a maximum fee of £60 for all seven Poker tournaments. Three aggregate winners will be awarded signed copies of Stewart Reuben's book "Pot-Limit and No-Limit Poker".
- [7] Please note that cash prizes and other prizes of value are against the law in England for Backgammon and Poker, except in licensed premises.
- [8] BACKGAMMON: The winner(s) of the Beginners Tournament may join the Weekend event, free of charge, starting round 4 on August 22<sup>nd</sup> and carrying over the score from the 3 rounds of the Beginners' Tournament.
- [9] BRIDGE: Those who do not qualify for the Pairs Championship Finals may then compete in the Open Pairs competition without any extra charge.
- [10] CHESS: MSO Masters Tournament. The strongest tournament this year is a 9-round. Swiss which offers all players opportunities to achieve IM and GM norms. Play will be each day at 15:30 playing to a rate of 40 moves in 2 hours followed by all moves in 1 hour. The entry fee for this tournament is based on chess playing strength. GM's, IM's, WGM's and WIM's are given a free entry. Rated 2400 + £20, Rated 2300 2399 £40, FIDE Masters, Women FIDE Masters £40, Players rated 2001-2149 £75. Players without international ratings: National ratings 2001 (BCF 175) or higher £100, National rating (BCF 174) or lower £150. Entry fees for players under 21 and over 60 on August 21st and physically handicapped players will receive a 50% reduction on the above fees.
- [11] GO: August 22nd 14:00 A lecture on Go by Paul Smith will be followed by a 9x9 beginners' tournament.
- [12] SHOGI: The first four prizes are reserved for the best Americans / Europeans. 5th £150, 6th £100 7th £50 are prizes available for anyone. £800 for the winning team (ie Europe or America) to be distributed between all players in the team in proportion to the number of games played for the team. An additional £2,500 allocated by national Shogi Federations in the USA, Russia, Norway, Sweden, Germany, the Netherlands, Belgium, France and Germany.
- [13] BRIDGE ON THE INTERNET: This is a virtual Bridge tournament (played via the Internet) for individuals, not pairs, organized by Bridge Player LIVE! Anyone may play. For full details send an e-mail to: info@bridgeplayer.com
- [14] FISCHER TIMING: The Fischer timing adds a fixed amount of time per move to each player's clock during a game. In the 10-minute "Fischer-timing" chess tournaments 10 seconds is added per move. In the 5-minute "Fischer-timing" chess tournaments 5 seconds per move is added.
- [15] COUNTDOWN: The Countdown contestants on August 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> will all have pre-qualified. Anyone who has not already been on the television programme "Countdown" may enter the Countdown tournament on August 25<sup>th</sup> by writing to: Countdown Office, Yorkshire Television, The TV Centre, Leeds LS3 1JS.
- [16] SCRABBLE PRIZES: At the start of each of the Scrabble tournaments every player will decide whether to play for the "Open" prizes, listed overleaf, which are for players using both British and American dictionaries (SOWPODS), or for players using the British dictionary only (OSW).
